Now an interpretive center, this grist mill built in the 1800s served as one of Henry Ford's first village industry plants. Come see Thompson Edison's original hydroelectric generator as it harnesses the power of the Rouge River.

This Victorian era village consists of nine historic structures relocated by volunteers on the banks of the Rouge River. This park like setting is nestled adjacent to a historic mill converted by Henry Ford into his first village industry plant with an operating water wheel.

Three floors of the museum present Dundee's history from the 1807 Macon Indian Reservation, through life in a Victorian village, to Dundee's continuing love affair with the automobile.
