
Between 1979 and 1994, Detroit Labor History Tours (DLHT) sought to highlight the history of Detroit's union movement through publications, multimedia productions, and tour programs. In 2004, as part of the celebration of the Michigan Humanities Council's 30th anniversary, the project that created *Working Detroit* was recognized as one of the Council's 30 outstanding initiatives. *Rivera's Labor Legacy*, a 1990 30 minute WTVS public television special produced by DLHT was honored as the Outstanding Cultrual Affairs Program at that year's Detroit / Michigan Emmy award ceremony. The *Labor Legacy Minutes* that are posted to the Guide were produced by WTVS and DLHT in 1981.
